## TO: Albizu University Community

## SUBJECT: COVID-19 – Remote Operations

Albizu University continues to monitor the spread of COVID-19. The following additional determinations have been made, by the senior leadership and the Institutional Committee created to handle this emergency:

- 1. The Miami Campus will offer its academic and administrative services remotely, until March 31, 2020. We are not conducting educational activities from the Miami Campus.
- Academic Activities during this period will continue, using the online pilot mechanism developed for this emergency. No student should attend the premises.
- The Goodman Center is not providing services to the general public until March 31. The Chancellor will share with you the clinical services continuity plan.
- Employees will contact the Director of Human Resources to coordinate visiting the facilities on Monday to collect whatever is needed to complete tasks, if necessary.
- 5. Official communication channels have been established to keep the university community informed about our operations, 24 hours a day:
