

## COVID-19 Return to Normal Update February 2021

Albizu University Miami Campus is currently in Phase I of Campus Operation Plans during the COVID-19 pandemic. As we allow the use of some of the campus facilities, we would like to provide you with recommendations when visiting our campus. Our institution adheres to the CDC social distancing recommendations and urges you to continue cooperating to ensure our community's health and safety, which includes students, employees, visitors, clients, and families. As a community, we can overcome the challenges that the pandemic presents.

Our institution has protocols to establish concrete measures to avoid contagion risks, including academic continuity plans. Please take the time to review the prevention measures recommended by the CDC and protocols we have developed to prevent the spread of COVID-19 among our community:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home when you are sick, except to get medical care.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Students who come to campus because they have a course scheduled on campus or who have an appointment to use the library services must use the temperature kiosk at the main campus entrance. Anyone with a temperature above 100 is asked to leave campus immediately and monitor their symptoms, seeking medical attention as appropriate. Furthermore,

- Students are required to wear a mask while on campus.
- Students should adhere to social distancing guidelines when on campus.
- Practice social distancing, as the virus is most transmissible indoors under close, sustained contact. If you are around other people, try to maintain 6 feet of separation.
- Students who have any illness symptoms should not come to campus and report this to their faculty or academic program
- director. Any student who has reported to have tested positive for COVID-19 to their academic
  program should quarantine for 14 days and provide either a COVID-19 test with negative results
  or a doctor's note that states they can return to campus. This is specific for students who have
  courses scheduled on campus or have booked a library appointment.
- For courses currently being held on campus, students who test positive for COVID-19 may join their courses using online learning during quarantine if they can. Faculty have been instructed to accommodate students who find themselves unable to attend on-site classes.

If you have tested positive for the COVID-19 virus, you must provide the results of a negative molecular test or a medical certificate indicating that it is safe for you to return to campus. Please email the Office of Student Affairs at dosa@albizu.edu before your return to the campus.
